

NLP Master Practitioner Project Write up Criteria

A Quick Synopsis:

In terms of what I look for in a successful modelling project, this is what I look for...

A meaningful background to the project for the modeller. A significant purpose in modelling your IT... the differences it makes for you and others. A well-formed outcome for the modelling. Models for at least 3 exemplars (at least 2 in person) present associated in an actual experience when being modelled, rather than just generally chatting about what you think they do. A self-model of the modeller's own process. Information on logical levels, filters, sub-modalities and NLP strategies for each exemplar including yourself. A streamlined model including an NLP strategy that works. Exemplars gained conscious awareness of aspects of how they do what they do, that they didn't previously have. That the you have tried out the model yourself and had it work for you - i.e. achieve the outcome. That you have shared it / taught your model to others and got feedback that it worked for them too.

That the written project demonstrates the above. That the modelling process was pretty clean - not full of assumptions and interpretations.

Overview:

Part of the certification process for Master Practitioner status is determined by your project write up meeting the following criteria:

The 'IT'

- A description of your project 'it' agreed with the course tutor(s)
- The importance of this 'it' to your work and to your life

Your Models Of Excellence

- How you came to choose your models of excellence. There must be at least three and at least two of these to be people to whom you have personal access
- How they demonstrate the 'it'
- The method of modelling that you used with each (should include at least one interview ideally one with each model) and your experience and learning of that process
- You use both implicit (what you observe and see on the surface behaviour) and implicit (what you elicit of the internal and unconscious elements of the experience) modelling methods

- Their experience of that process and how it added value for them
- The individual explicit model that you gleaned from each
- Each model of excellence learns something about the unconscious elements of the way that they achieve 'it' of which they were previously unaware

The Goals Of The Project

- Your measurable outcome for modelling this 'it' i.e. how you know that others have 'it' and how you know in measurable terms that you have it and how you know when you have imparted 'it' to others
- How others recognise that you have it and what feedback you have gained to demonstrate this and the results of others having 'it'

The Model

- The model that you gained from each model of excellence
- The generic model that you have developed overall by identifying the common denominators for each and the results of your experience of using the model
- The model includes aspects of the logical levels model plus the submodalities of the 'it'

The Presentation

- Your experience of presenting the model to others
- How others recognised that you were using the model
- What they learned from your presentation about 'it'

NLP

How you have and are living out the NLP presuppositions (Beliefs of Excellence) in the way that you went about and continue to go about your modelling project... and any other presuppositions that you believe underpin NLP modelling.



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
